- 1. Promote and enhance awareness and advocacy of Conservation Agriculture (CA)
  - Intensify efforts to advocate for and promote the benefits of Conservation Agriculture globally, particularly in the regions with low adoption rates.
  - Actively lobby for integrating CA practices into agricultural policies at both local and national levels worldwide.
- 2. Increase financial investment, funding, and market opportunities for CA through appropriate partnerships, mechanisms, and incentives while providing decent jobs and empowering women and youth.
- 3. Recognise, respect and use farmers as key drivers and innovators of CA
  - Harness and support a farmer-centered CA Innovation Systems approach to increase learning, adaptation, and adoption.\
- 4. Increase support for small-scale farmers
  - Prioritize promoting sustainable agricultural mechanisation, developing affordable machinery, and establishing comprehensive support plans, including funding and maintenance, to foster sustainable CA adoption among small-scale farmers with sustainable mechanisation service providers.
- 5. Promote accessible practical literature, extension and rural advisory services
  - Renew initiatives to create practical literature on CA, share knowledge and experience, and showcase its feasibility across various systems and regions for easy public access.
- 6. Increase Public education/awareness of CA benefits
  - Provide clear and precise information about Conservation Agriculture to enhance public understanding of its positive impacts on food security.
- 7. Establish a CA Hall of Fame to reward CA practitioners
  - Revisit the 8th World Congress on Conservation Agriculture (WCCA) proposal to create a CA Hall of Fame and a directory of specialists/scientists and practitioners to facilitate access to valuable knowledge.
- 8. Enhance Research and Development
  - Expand the capabilities of researchers and scientists to conduct studies on CA and effectively disseminate findings to the agricultural industry.
